WARNINGS:



Do not install or use the charger near flammable, explosive, harsh, or combustible materials, chemicals, or vapors.

Turn off input power at the circuit breaker before installing or maintaining.

Do not use or stop using the charger if it is defective, appears cracked, frayed, broken or otherwise damaged, or fails to operate.

Do not attempt to open, disassemble, repair, tamper with, or modify the charger. The charger is not user serviceable. Contact iocharger or authorized service provider for any repairs.

Do not touch the charger sockets with sharp metallic objects, such as wire, tools or needles.

Do not put fingers into the charger sockets.

Do not use this charger if the EV charging cable is frayed, has broken insulation, or displays any other indication of damage.

Do not use this charger if the enclosure or the EV charging connector is broken, cracked, open, or shows any other indication of damage.

CAUTIONS: /



The charger should be installed only by a qualified approved technician.

Make sure that the materials used and the installation procedures follow local building codes and safety standards.

Incorrect installation and testing of the charger could potentially damage either the vehicle's Battery and/or the charger itself. Any resulting damage is excluded from the warranty for both the vehicle and the charger.

Do not operate the charger in temperatures outside its operating range of -30°C to +50 °C.

Ensure that the EV charging cable is positioned properly to the charging sockets.

Do not use cleaning solvents to clean any of the charger's components.

NOTES BEFORE INSTALLATION

The charger should be protected by an external Residual Current Device (RCD) to be installed in the upstream circuit which complies with the following:

- Rated residual operating current not exceeding 30 mA
- Type-A





STEP TWO- WALL MOUNTING & WIRING

1. Remove the backplate from the charger and mount the backplate to the wall




2. Connect the cable through the bottom of the junction box ensure **conduit** is connected to the bottom of the power box



3. Electrical Connection

In Australia only the TN network is used, as shown on the label on the back plate.





STEP THREE - INSTALL THE CHARGER

1. Install the charger to the backplate



2. Fix the charger and backplate with screw




STEP FOUR - INTERNET CONNECTION

Ethernet - Commercial, Apartment or Home installations

Please connect the ethernet cable to the WAN port this should connect automatically to the internet if there's no IT restrictions,

(if static IP address is required please refer to the Ocular Configuration manual)
(See Ocular or local supplier for manual)



Wi-Fi

(Not recommend in commercial installations or apartments.) Please note: unstable/weak WI-FI connection may cause undesired operational issues. Please call installer if Wi-fi signal is insufficient.

Wi-Fi Connection Guide-

<u>Do not change settings other than outlined below as this may affect</u> operations.

Step 1: Find the chargers' local hotspot

This hot spot will have the following SSID: IOC - 2.4GHz - ******

The password for this Hotspot is: IOC12345

Step 2: Navigate to the web-interface of the Ocular Charger

After being connected to the Hotspot, open Microsoft Edge or Google Chrome and navigate to: 192.168.10.1:8900

The web interface will ask for Username and Password, the information is:

Username: install

Password: installer123

Step 3: Navigate to the Network and set up WIFI configuration

Ocular charger support connection via WiFi. Simply press the "Scan" button to start scanning for available WiFi network



After this, press the down arrow in the drop list to see all the available



Choose the Wi-Fi SSID that you prefer, and then input the Wi-Fi Password




If Static IP address is required, simply disable DHCP under WiFi section and put in the Static IP Address for the device



Step 4: Submit then reboot the charger to apply changes

Regarding the installation of the Ocular IQ Solar, each charger will need a power connection and an additional internet connection to allow smart charging with energy tracking, smart control and load management.

- · Power connection
- Internet connection (required for smart functions)

Regarding the power connection of the chargers, each charger will have its own designated circuit from the distribution board as per required in Appendix P, AS 3000:2018 Australia Standard for EV charging stations. We recommend 40A type A RCBO for the IQ Solar to avoid nuisance tripping


Regarding the Internet connection, we recommend running an Ethernet cable from the communication infrastructure comms cabinet to the charger for internet connection. Wi-fi can be used when the signal is strong. Above 3 bars

STEP FIVE- CT CLAMP INSTALLATION & WIRING

1. Please run the CT clamp wires through the grey gland/hole located at the bottom of the charger.



2. Please connect internally following this diagram:



STEP SIX - CT CLAMP SPEC REQUIREMENTS

Prior to setting up the CT clamps, please ensure that you have the correct CT and CT Ratio setup.

Only use CT clamps provided by Ocular – The wrong CT clamps will cause a misreading and void warranty. If you must use your own CT please speak to Ocular and confirm suitability.

The Rate Transformation Ratio must be 2000:1 or the CT clamps will generate incorrect readings.

STEP SEVEN - CT CLAMP CONFIGURATION

<u>Do not change settings other than outlined below as this may affect</u> <u>operations.</u>

Step 1: Log in to the configuration page of the web page.

Step 2: Go to the 'Advanced' section

Step 3: Navigate to the balance page.

Step 4: In 'Mode', select 'Master TCP Server'.

Step 5: In 'Data Format', select 'Modbus RTU' and the TCP port will automatically allocate the default address of **22401**.


Step 6: In 'Power Type', select 'Gateway'

Step 7: Set 'SelfGroupId' to 1

Step 8: Set 'JoinGroupId' to -1

Step 9: Set Basic Broadcast Port to 10000

Step 10: Turn on the "Solar" switch and set the energy mode to "Full" by default customer will be able to change this on the APP. Do not change on the backend



STEP EIGHT (A) - CT SINGLE PHASE SETUP

The CT Arrow should allign with the image below. The arrow should be from the Grid to the Home

The CT clamp is connected to the P1-N1 terminals using the red and black signal wires.

The CT clamp is installed in the main MCB input terminal at the L1 position, with the direction pointing from the grid to the home as below.

Do not change settings other than outlined below as this may affect operations.

Step 1: Turn on the HUB1 switch.

Step 2: Set the address to 254.

Step 3: Turn off the 3-Phase switch.


Step 4: Set the CT1 position to "Main." Set the ratio to

2000:1 and set the phase to default to "L1."



SINGLE PHASE CT INSTALL

The CT Arrow should allign with the image below. The arrow should be from the Grid to the Home



STEP EIGHT (B) - CT THREE PHASE SETUP

The CT Arrow should allign with the image below. The arrow should be from the Grid to the Home

CT Clamp 1, CT Clamp 2, and CT Clamp 3 are connected to the P1-N1, P2-N2, and P3-N3 terminals respectively using the red and black signal wires.

CT Clamp 1, CT Clamp 2, and CT Clamp 3 are installed in the main MCB input terminals at the L1, L2 and L3 positions respectively, with the direction pointing towards the direction pointing from the grid to the home as below.

<u>Do not change settings other than outlined below as this may affect</u> operations.

Step 1: Turn on the HUB1 switch.

Step 2: Set the address to 254.


Step 3: Turn on the 3-Phase switch.

Step 4: Set the CT1 position to "Main." Set the ratio to 2000:1 and set the phase to default to "L1."



THREE-PHASE CT INSTALL

The CT Arrow should allign with the image below. The arrow should be from the Grid to the Home



STEP NINE - CT CLAMP CONFIGURATION (Continued)


Grid Current (*please note scale is 0.1A so 1 Amp is a value of 10*)

- 1. Rated Current: This is the maximum current that the main MCB can handle.
- 2. Safe Current: This is the safe current reserved to prevent the circuit from overloading. The actual available current for the charging station is calculated as follows: Actual available current = Rated current Safe current Load current.
- 3. Limit Total Charger Current: This is the actual available current in the circuit, which is equal to the rated current plus the solar power generation current. The default maximum value is usually 65535. This should not be changed.

For example, a 80Amp distribution board should have

Rated Current – 800

Safe Current –80 (10% safety is recommended as a minimum This can be higher is required. The charger will load manage and stop charging completely if it sees load above 720 which is 72 Amps.)



Idle: Interval for reporting status when idle (Default is 30 seconds)

Charging: Interval for reporting status when charging (Default is 30 seconds)




STEP TEN - VERIFY THE INSTALLATION

- 1. Verify the power cables are wired properly
- Close the upstream RCD to power on the charger unit, and you should see the LED lights sequentially illuminate blue.
- 3. If the LED red light illuminates or flashes, refer to the troubleshooting table on page 13.
- 4. Check on the screen display whether internet is available and the back office is connected, refer to page 17-19.
- 5. Verify the settings on the backend (specifically energy management server) match settings in image to right
- 6. Test the live charging process with simulator or electric vehicle if the installation is completely verified.
